

"Day to Day Faith"



Several years ago, while wandering through the kitchen at the church, I noticed a framed picture hanging on the wall. It caught my attention, and I spent a moment reading the framed words. It was one of those things that I tucked away in the back of my mind. Fast forward several years. Last week, as I was preparing for Kay Ratcliff's memorial service, Kay's daughter Julia reflected on how her mom continually referred to a framed version of "The Quaker Dozen" during Julia's childhood. At this moment, I realized I had seen "The Quaker Dozen" several years earlier hanging in the church kitchen. As I re-read the plague, it became obvious that it was filled with wisdom on how we should live our lives. The principles pointed out as "The Quaker Dozen" are listed below:

- 1. Begin each day with prayer.
- 2. Work hard.
- 3. Love your family.
- 4. Make light of your troubles.
- 5. Follow the Golden Rule
- 6. Read from your Bible.
- 7. Show kindness.
- 8. Read worthwhile books.
- 9. Be clean and pure.
- 10. Have charity in your heart.
- 11. Be obedient and respectful.
- 12. End the day in prayer.

As believers in Christ, these are a great reminder of the call before us as we live out our daily witness before our family, friends, and community. We will be looking at how God calls us to live our lives out in a simple, practical way through our June and July sermon series, called "The Quaker Dozen." As we remind ourselves of this way of life, I am reminded once again that the consistency of the daily moments builds the sum total of our Christian witness to the world around us. We look forward to this simple and practical view of our daily walk in Christ.
