Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live." John 11:25 (ESV)

Over the past few years, our meeting has spent a significant amount of time grieving the loss of several wonderful people who were not only faithful to their families, our community, and our church but were also faithful followers of Jesus. It is always difficult to experience this kind of loss in our personal lives.

As we celebrate their well-lived lives we often focus on stories and events that occurred over their lifetime. These stories emphasize their commitment to family, their kindness, their servanthood, and even their faith walk. But as we reflect on these stories and events we often forget to step back and reflect on the deep and significant meaning that these stories point to in the life of a Christian. In 1 Corinthians 15:22, Paul assures, "For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive." This hope provides comfort and a reason for celebration for those of us who remain here in our physical lives. The memories, stories, and events we celebrate don't just point to the believer's earthly life, they point to their life in eternity in the presence of a living God.

As we move closer to our celebration of Easter we should likewise not only focus on the stories of Jesus' life and the event of Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection. We should also reflect on what an empty tomb really means. An empty tomb means His life was authentic! The stories and events of his life mean that scripture is authentic – the story is REAL! The stories and events surrounding the sadness of His death, burial, and resurrection exclaim Christ is ALIVE! He is who He claimed to be, He is doing what He claimed He would be doing. He IS ALIVE, sitting at the right hand of the Father, and He is returning.



Praise God that as we celebrate the stories and events of the lives of our loved ones who lived lives as Christ followers we can have peace, comfort, and assurance that those stories and memories point to eternity. Likewise, as we celebrate Easter we can move our hearts beyond the stories and events of Jesus' life to the realization that His life, death, and resurrection provide that same eternity for us if we place our faith in Him and walk with him day by day.
