A Note on Giving to Those of You Who Are Over 70

It's nearing the end of the calendar year, and I wanted to remind you that you can take advantage of the IRA-qualified charitable distribution law to help manage both your charitable intent and your tax liabilities.

The law allows you to "count" charitable contributions from your traditional IRA toward your required minimum distributions beginning the year you turn 701/2. By directing your distribution from your IRA administrator directly to a charity, it moves without tax consequence to you or the charity. This is a tax-efficient way to support the church and other causes you care about!

With the new tax laws in effect that significantly increase the personal deduction, more people will not be filing the long form that enabled them to deduct charitable contributions. The IRA direct distribution keeps those funds from being counted as income to you, so no taxes are due on that distribution.

More information is available from your tax advisor, attorney, or administrator of your IRA.
