### “Rejoice in the Lord”

*“Yet I will rejoice in the Lord! I will be joyful in the God of my salvation!” Habakkuk 3:18 (NLT)*

The verse printed above is the concluding prayer of the prophet Habakkuk as he concludes his short book. After questioning God about the circumstances of his world and why God is letting that happen, Habakkuk comes to this conclusion: “Yet, I will rejoice in the Lord.” He had questioned God about why there is so much violence; why is there so much greed; why is there so much immorality; why are there so many atrocities; and why is there so much rejection of God’s ways? He had begged God to intervene. He kept asking God how long he was waiting to fix the problems. **God gave Habakkuk several answers, but the most important one was that “the just (or righteous) shall live by faith.”**

The questions and the answers in this ancient book are not just for the nation of Israel in 600 BC. They are questions that we ask today – over and over again. The answer is the same for us. We come to the conclusion that God is in control and that he really is acting in our time and that he is working things out according to his purposes. The command to us is also to live by

faith that God has worked in our lives and in the world in the past. We take the time to recount how God has crossed paths with us and how he has guided certain circumstances in our lives. We read the Bible and see how God has worked in history in miraculous and amazing ways. As we review the past, we gain confidence that we can walk by faith – live our lives believing that God loves us and is walking with us in our journey of life.

We come to worship each Sunday to lay our questions and concerns before God, to be reminded of his word to us in the Bible, and to marvel at his majesty. This will allow him to refresh us and to empower us to truly “be joyful in the God of our salvation.” Despite everything going on in our lives and in the world today, worship allows us to see that God is working and he has not forgotten us,

## Quaker Beliefs, Part 2

### What do YOU believe About the Lord Jesus Christ?

**Introduction** – Last month we started a newsletter section about what Quakers believe. Our first discussion centered around “God.” This month we move on to discuss “The Lord Jesus Christ.” Each month we will continue to be given the Quaker statement, scripture references, and a brief summary of what it is saying.

#### **Belief Statement – About the Lord Jesus Christ**

“It is with reverence and thanksgiving that we profess our unwavering allegiance to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. In Him was life and the light of men. He is the eternal Word who was with God and was God, revealing Himself in infinite wisdom and love both as Man’s Creator and Redeemer. Conceived of the Holy Ghost, born of the virgin Mary, the Word was made flesh, and dwelt amongst men. He came in the fullness of time, being foreordained before the foundation of the world that He might fulfill the eternal counsel of the righteousness and love of God for the redemption of man. In Him dwelleth all the fullness of the Godhead bodily. He became obedient unto the death of the cross, and is a propitiation for our sins, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins according to the riches of His grace. He was buried and rose again the third day according to the scriptures, ascended into heaven, and hath sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, now to appear in the presence of God for us. This same Jesus, which is taken up into heaven shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven. And now, while thus watching and waiting, we rejoice to believe that He is our King and Savior. He is the one Mediator of the new and everlasting covenant who makes peace and reconciliation between God the offended and man the offending; the great High Priest whose priesthood is unchangeable. He is able to save them to the uttermost that come unto God through Him.” - *Faith and Practice 2018*



## Spiceland Freedom Days

July 8 & 9 will be busy days for Spiceland Friends Church and the Spiceland Community. We decided to serve a Ham & Beans Supper on Friday evening and a Pancake Breakfast on Saturday morning. The organizations that usually serve these meals have decided not to do it this year. This is a perfect opportunity for us to invite the community into our church to eat and have fellowship time.

The proceeds from the supper will go to the Sharing Hope Organization where Nancy Wadman goes on mission trips every year to serve people who have been touched by natural disasters. They have traveled to Alaska, Florida, South Carolina, Louisiana, Ohio, and Tennessee the last several years. Sharing Hope rebuilds and repairs homes that have been destroyed or damaged by hurricanes, floods and tornadoes. They generally repair 15-20 homes each year for low-income families whose insurance doesn't cover the total cost. Sharing Hope raises money through an annual auction and donations from churches. The proceeds from the pancake breakfast will go to our church's Mission & Evangelism/ Community Concerns Committee to be spent for local families and nonprofit organizations that we support each year.

There will be sign-up sheets in the Welcome Center the last two weeks of June asking for donations of food and workers for these two events.

I am excited about this opportunity to share not only our building but having time to fellowship with the community and raise money for such worthy causes.
