"Become an Encourager"

"Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." 1 Thessalonians 5:11



The verse above is our theme verse for this month. Paul wrote this to the Thessalonian Church and the surrounding churches. He had visited all of those cities and towns on his first missionary journey and in each place a new body of believers had formed and they had begun to worship each week together. His letter was designed to instruct them in the faith and to encourage them to keep the faith in the midst of persecution and constant pressure to return to their old ways.

As he comes to the end of his letter, he lists ten specific ways we can practice encouraging one another and building each other up. (Thessalonians 5:12-19)

- 1. Live in peace with one another
- 2. Encourage the disheartened
- 3. Help the weak
- 4. Be patient with everyone
- 5. Make sure that nobody pays back wrong

for wrong, but strive to do what is good for each other

- 6. Rejoice always
- 7. Pray continually
- 8. Give thanks in all circumstances for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus
- 9. Brothers and sisters, pray for us
- 10. Do not quench the Spirit

Read these suggestions, reflect on them, and begin to apply them in new ways with people around you. After I wrote this article, I went to sleep before sending it in. During the night I had a very vivid dream. In the dream, a spontaneous gathering of about 30 people was happening at our house. The people were all from SFC. Some had brought food, some had just come. Strangely, my house was big enough for them all in this dream. I could not figure out why everyone had come. I asked several people and they all said we just felt like we should get together to encourage each other. Apparently, something terrible had happened (the dream never made it clear what that was) and their first reaction was to gather with other believers to pray together, to fellowship, and to encourage each other. That is exactly what Paul was encouraging in his letter. Our church was putting these principles to work in a practical way. We should encourage other believers, but also everyone around us and unknown people that God brings across our path.

Come and join us each week as we study the life lessons that Jesus taught us and take some time to encourage others around you on Sundays and all through the week.

One Question After Another – Episode 1

One of my goals for 2023 has been to do more personal reading. In doing this, I thought it would be enjoyable to read through and digest Quaker "Faith and Practice." Early in my reading, I stumbled across a list of guestions intended to stimulate our thinking and hearts as we live out our Christian faith in the daily grind of life. Historically, early Friends called these questions "Queries." They were commonly used during unprogrammed (silent meetings) to help turn hearts and minds toward God's thoughts for worship. These questions are an excellent way for us to consider our faith journey. I plan to address these questions (queries) one at a time in our 2023 newsletters. I pray that you meditate sincerely on these questions in a way that brings closeness and confidence to your Christian walk.

Here is the question for March – "Do you seek to maintain a Christian life and to be watchful that worldly affairs do not unduly absorb you?"

We live in a world that depends on our absorption of worldly affairs. Everything around us begs to pull us into the world and away from Christ. Every product sold, and every newsreel we see is positioned to move our minds toward worldly affairs. With each mouse click on email ads and social media, we see the things of this world pulling us in like a magnet.

Practically speaking, it is up to us to put our minds and hearts in a place where we can hear God's voice. I encourage you to turn down the noise. Take in the day's news in a way that lets you be informed but not absorbed. Limit your time on electronic media. Use social media to encourage others. Seek out actual people to have as friends. Guard your time each day in a way that prioritizes your relationship with Christ. When we decide to have a relationship with Christ, we are given God's Holy Spirit. Let's get quiet and listen to Him and allow the affairs of this world to *"grow strangely dim in the light of His glory and grace."*
