God Never Gives up on You

"Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me" Psalm 51:10 (NIV)



Over the past few weeks in our worship services, we have considered how God builds his character into us. We studied Proverbs which taught us that we must always be on a search for God's wisdom for our lives. We studied the life of Moses, Gideon, and David – all who did great things for God and for the people they led. However, each one of them had their problems and their sin. Each one of them would have been disqualified if we were doing the choosing. It was not that God overlooked their weaknesses and sins – no, he recognized their weaknesses, forgave their sin, and gave them his power to do his work. They became known for God's power and direction in their lives rather than being defined by their weakness and sins.

Our theme for the next few weeks, "God Never Gives Up on You," is borrowed from Max Lucado's most recent book by the same title. His book is about Jacob and the rest of the title is "what Jacob's story teaches us about grace, mercy, and relentless love." Throughout scripture, God many times identified himself as "the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob." All of them had their problems, but Jacob's name means "Deceiver" and he lived up to his name – tricking his brother, his father, and his uncle. He was not a good leader to his growing family, and he seldom sought the wisdom of God. And yet, God did not give up on him and continued to pursue him and turn him into the person he wanted him to be.

We will be studying several people who, like Jacob, were flawed in many ways but God did not give up on them. Instead, he continued to love them and draw them to himself, he continued to forgive their sin, and he continued to build his character into them in spite of their flaws. Moses had blood on his hands, Abraham was an intentional liar, Elijah was a coward, Jacob was a liar and cheat, Esther kept her faith a secret, Peter was a betrayer, Paul was a murderer, and the list could go on from the Bible, but also including us here and now. We have a hard time believing that God can let go of our past problems and work with us in the many ways he wants to.

We can say along with Paul: "But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:13-14 ESV) Come and prayerfully join us each Sunday for worship and consideration of what we can learn from these Biblical characters and how God can use us for his work in our world.

As we seek God in prayer, we acknowledge that God draws our family and friends into a relationship with Himself. We quickly forget that we are simply an instrument for God to use in this process. As we seek to grow God's Kingdom and share the good news of Jesus with our friends and family, let's be obedient to Christ as we pray for them. May we be willing to be used by God for others to see Jesus. May we be subject to God's perfect timing as we live our lives in front of those who need the gospel. May we be God's instrument in this process and not his boss. It is Christ who has authority as we read Matthew 28:18-20.

"Jesus came and told his disciples, 'I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Many Hands Make Light Work

We've all heard this adage. Even Moses' father-in-law used it. Well maybe not those exact words, but essentially that was his advice to his sonin-law. We read in Exodus that Moses alone was responsible for acting as judge for all the people. When Jethro saw all that Moses was doing for the people, he said, "Why do you sit alone . . . ? You will certainly wear yourself out, for the thing is too heavy for you. You are not able to do it alone." Jethro went on to tell Moses that he needed to look for good men to share this burden of settling matters among the people. Moses saw the wisdom in his father-in-law's advice and we should also.

As a congregation we are charged with guiding young people to come to know and love God. A few faithful people have been dedicated to this important work but they can't do it alone. More are needed to share this great responsibility. There are opportunities to help with all age levels during both Sunday school and worship. You could volunteer for one Sunday a month or maybe one month per quarter. Perhaps you could find one or more people to serve with you and create a schedule that works for everyone. Easy to use lessons and materials are available so no planning is necessary. With enough people to share the responsibilities, this would give everyone the opportunity to also attend an adult Sunday school class and worship at times.
